FROM THE EDITOR...

As you read in the May issue of The Mountaineer Phi Psi, the House Corporation is working diligently on several matters to assure the Fraternity House is "up to code" and presents a good living experience for the undergrads. Recently, you should have received a letter from the James Cochran House Association "The House Corp" asking for your comments/input on this very important subject.

Over the past six years, the "The Preserving Our History Campaign" raised almost \$200,000. That money has been used for small remodeling jobs; required maintenance; and scholarship. What has been realized is that \$200,000 is a minimal sum when you are working with a chapter house that was built in 1941, with the new addition having been added in 1968.

While we have kept the infrastructure in a maintainable state as repairs required, we are now faced with large needs such as replacing electricity, plumbing, and a sprinkler system. The House Corporation hired a professional engineer to guide us and provide a cost estimate.

The engineer's cost estimate = \$919,000

What is not included in the above is the engineering cost nor the architect cost should we need one. Additional monies also not included in the above, would be needed for a new roof, commercial kitchen upgrade, exterior renovations (painting, fixing columns), elevator for handicap (ADA), security system upgrade, fixtures, and equipment.

The engineer's cost estimate = \$750,000

When you factor the total cost of engineering, architectural planning, construction, establishing a maintenance (sinking) fund, along with providing a budget for a House Manager or House Parent

The House Corporation total cost estimate = \$2,500,000

While this is a lot of money, many of us in Morgantown who have been involved with the chapter for many years believe it is worth preserving. During my fifteen years as editor of The Mountaineer Phi Psi, I have received hundred's of notes and letters from many of you reflecting on your personal fraternity experiences. But none better than the following which was written in February 1990:

"Attending the 50's reunion in October was, somewhat to my surprise, an extremely emotional experience for me. I had expected it to be a happy gathering—and a sad one—but not so profoundly in either regards. I was glad to see these aging brothers, many of whom I had not

seen for over thirty-years, and mercifully, they were glad to see me too. It was curiously refreshing to find that underneath the balding and graying exteriors lurked the same delightfully quirky personalities that had drawn me to 780 Spruce Street in the first instance. And on the second night when we joined hands and sang 'Amici', I was simply overcome and unable to finish the hymn.

Since that night I have tried to understand why it was such an intensely emotional experience for me. Why was this bond so strong after all these years? I have concluded that it must have been this: we left home at the same time, settled in the same town for a few years, ate at the same table, partied together in the same pine-paneled rooms, rooted for the same teams, studied together in the same rooms, and subscribed to the same fraternal process.

The silly fads and popular songs and TV shows and news stories and movies and political issues that we experienced-- touched our contemporaries in a hundred other campuses (and in Morgantown in a dozen other fraternities) —but never in quite the same way that they touched us, because we were different, not different singly, but different together. And now, as we look down the shorter side of our lives we find that we are still, in a greater sense than we may have imagined, WHO we are and WHAT we are because of what we experienced at 780 Spruce Street. And in coming together again this October, we reconfirmed both our own identities and our identification with each other.

Before that reunion I had, I now realize, underestimated the human bond we had formed at West Virginia Alpha. On those two October nights, as we had exchanged fragments of our lives—old guys trying to bridge the gulf of years—I suddenly realized that we had loved each other far more deeply than I had ever imagined."

- Charles Vest '60, former head of MIT, was awarded the nation's highest honor for technology at a recent White House ceremony. Vest, and five others, received the 2006 National Medal of Technology from President Bush. The award, which Congress established in 1980, honors those who improve the quality of life through research and technology.
- West Virginia University recently received a \$25MM gift from a former employee and her husband, who earned his degree from the university while working night shift in a coal mine. The donation by Jo and Ben Statler is the single largest ever given to the University. The pledge will come intwo parts. The first \$5MM will go to WVU's Mary Babb Randolph Cancer Center. About half that money will fund a bus to travel the state and provide breast cancer screenings to women in rural areas. The other half will fund an endowed chair of breast cancer research. The Statler's also pledged \$20MM to the Health Sciences Center, the College of Engineering and Mineral Resources, and for a new scoreboard at The Coliseum.
- Following the Fall Rush of all fraternities, WVU released "unofficial" figures that reflect a total of 643 active and associate members. The largest membership are the Phi Psi's with 73. The smallest, Pi Kappa Alpha with 23.

- September 20-23 at Deep Creek Lake, MD. In addition to activities at the lake, many gathered before/after the game in the "Blue Lot" to renew acquaintances. Also during that weekend, several gathered on Saturday evening (downtown) to celebrate the 60th birthday of **Brad Layne '66.**
- On behalf of the chapter, they wish to express their gratitude to **Jim Lorenze '74** (and his business, Superior Photo) for his many contributions to chapter as respects film, picture development, photo albums. Mike Garrison became WVU's 22nd president on September 21, 2007.
- Thomas E. Messmore '64, was recognized in the Spring 2007 WVU Foundation newsletter, 'Board Profiles' as one of it's newest members. The 1967 graduate is the owner of T.E. Messmore Associates, LLC, an analytical consulting firm that focuses on risk and investment management. In retirement, he is developing a computer language which facilitates financial modeling, statistical analysis, and simulation. Raised in Fairmont, WV, brother Messmore graduated with honors from WVU and received a BS in Industrial Engineering and earned his MBA from Harvard University in 1969. While at WVU, he was a member of Mountain, Tau Beta Pi, and Alpha Pi Mu. Since 1997, he has held multiple positions with Zurich Insurance Group in New York and Switzerland. He, and his wife Sharon, a 1968 graduate of Fairmont State College, reside in Alton Bay, NH.

PIKES' BELL STILL

(the following is a reprint from the Morgantown Dominion Post, Of Saturday, October 20, 2007. Written by John Samsell)

Another homecoming and another homecoming without the bell. Oh, you may hear a bell at Milan Puskar Stadium, Mountaineer Field, but it will be of electronic variety. It won't be the locomotive bell that Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity, known as the Pikes, rang for

more than 50 years at WVU football games. The bell went missing when the fraternity's local Alpha Theta Chapter was inactive from 1998-2001, according to Bill Chittum of Morgantown.

I've often mentioned how the bell had a routine role in football Saturday's in Morgantown. We could hear it regularly from long distances, a signal that game-time was near. The Pikes, founded in 1868, at the University of Virginia, recently observed their 189th

Founder's Day. For that occasion, William R. "Mitch" Michell, of the class of 1960, wrote about "The Legend of the Alpha Theta Bell", based upon the recollections of Clyde Robert Cattrell, class of 1939, who along with other fraternity brothers obtained the bell in 1940.

Cattrell said he and Art Weeks got the idea of obtaining the bell while visiting Carnegie Tech in Pittsburgh. The fraternity chapter there had a locomotive bell that was used to call members to dinner. One of the WVU members said he knew where such a bell might be obtained, although the location was kept secret. Six chapter members piled into a 1936 Packard and went in search of the bell. But they were unsuccessful in their first endeavor.

Several nights later, Cattrell said, he and two others made another try, this time in a 1939 Plymouth business coupe. It was a cold and foggy trip through the West Virginia mountains after dark, and this time they were able to obtain the bell. The trip back to Morgantown was remembered as an adventure in itself. Rain turned to sleet and

some mountaintops required two of the three pushing the car on icy roadways. They arrived back at the chapter house on North Spruce Street at 2:30 in the morning. Mitchell noted the large, all brass locomotive bell was taken to most WVU home football games, "clanging out its victory cheers for every Mountaineer advance". He said there were spontaneous victory parades following major wins, with the bell leading the way.

The bell also sounded the beginning of "thuses" with bonfires on the old athletic field (where the Mountainlair Plaza is today), the night before a home game. Actually, homecomings and other football "Saturday's" haven't been the same without the bell's sounds ringing through the streets of the city. Like the echoing of the unique voice of 'Chop 'em Down Henderson' heard at old Mountaineer Field, the bell has its own place in history.
