Nominees must meet certain criteria, including being alumni of the college; being at least 10-years post-degree; and distinguished themselves by success in business or life at the regional, national, or inter-national level. - On September 14th, 2013 Tom (and Janet) Rogers

- WVU President Jim Clements announced during his 2013 State of the University the following: (1) in the last four years, the University has grown by 4% to 32,595; (2) major state funding reductions, including \$16MM this year alone; (3) noting that peer universities, on average, charge \$3,000 more per student for in-state tuition.
- In addition to the WVU stunning victory over Oklahoma State on September 28th, former NASA astronaut Col. Edward Michael Fincke, of Pittsburgh, PA was

recognized during the game as he brought a WVU Flag with him during the last Space Shuttle Mission trip.

Your James Cochran House Association continues to strive to address the issues of our fraternity. We embarked on a strategic plan to do several initiatives in 2013. The first was to have a more balanced & representative Board which included younger members, along with out –of-state members. This was accomplished with the addition of **Kevin Silard '89** (Washington, DC) and Justin Grosso '08 (Pittsburgh, PA). They join Justin Heydon'07 (Morgantown, WV), who joined the Board in 2012.

I am extremely pleased to announce our board is very close to inking permanent financing for the renovations completed several years ago. This has been a two-year task, having met with several lenders. I fully expect to have the financing package completed by November 1 at a fixed rate, increased term and amortization rate. We currently have a mortgages totaling \$1.72 million.

To do the above, re-organizing the Board was necessary. As with many volunteer organizations we needed participation and accountability of 100%. To achieve this, we are now using the committee approach to accomplish our work. Each Board member has been assigned to a committee to address the strategic and the day-to-day needs. At this writing, this appears to be working.

Having accomplished 80% of the renovation of the Chapter house and raising \$1,075,000 through the "Assuring Our Future Campaign", we still are in need of financial support to finish and maintain what we have started.

Key Board members that saw this project through are Andy Wilkins '65, Gary Waters'74, our Treasurer, Zach Mendelson'79, Terry Turner'70, our Chapter Advisor, and me. Naturally others assisted.

The last key strategic area is membership. We had made the change of pledge education two years ago asking **Zach Mendelson'79** and **Jim Lorenze'74** to take this responsibility allowing **Terry Turner '70** to use his time on being the overall Chapter Advisor.

Tom Wiley'76 was asked to become involved with the "RUSH" process working with the undergraduates to train and mentor their work. I am pleased to report that we have the largest Fall pledge class in many years. 35 young men started their pledge training on September 22nd. Membership allows us to maintain a full house which in turn allows us to be financially responsible.

It is the Board's direction that academic standards and results are part of our strategic plan. We are working with the chapter officers and chapter as a whole to accomplish this goal.

The Board elected new officers this past summer with me as President, **Tom Wiley'76** as Vice-President, **Justin Grosso'08** as secretary and **Gary Waters'74** remains as Treasurer. **Terry Turner'70** remains Chapter advisor and **Jim Harner'64** remains as Faculty advisor. This group along with your Board members will continue to manage the day to day and long term responsibilities of West Virginia Alpha.










Doug Stoup '83 proudly displays our colors upon his arrival at the Geographic North Pole April 16th, 2013!

Dear Brothers:

On August 15th our fraternity (and WVU) lost a terrific alumnus, **Robert McNabb '67.** The following was written by his brother. Brother McNabb was a special human being who was always more interested in everybody else.

Bobby leaves his spouse and life partner of 25 years Debi, a son Robbe who is a senior at Texas Christian University and a daughter Kristen, an entrepreneur, wife and mother who resides with her family in Austin, Texas. Our Mother, Mary Anna and our Brother Mark both reside in Houston. Some of you will know pieces of Bobby's background but most won't know the entirety. Bobby and I grew up sharing a bunk bed and became closer as we grew up. He attended primary and secondary schools in Charleston, West Virginia (our hometown). During high school he was a state doubles tennis champion at Charleston High School and also was first team All Kanawha Conference in basketball. The same conference which produced many great professional and college basketball players including Jerry West, Hot Rod Hundley, Jason Williams and Randy Moss (who also played basketball but was more known as an all pro NFL receiver) and many more. Bob was a great athlete. He attended West Virginia University and graduated in 1970. During his undergraduate years he was inducted into Mountain, the top WVU honorary and was also the student representative on the WVU Athletic Council where he became close friends with Bobby Bowden who was the WVU football coach at that time prior to his moving to Florida State. He then completed an advanced management program at The Wharton School of Business at The University of Pennsylvania. Bobby then gravitated into the human capital business about 40 years ago and became known worldwide as a human capital thought leader. He retired from Korn/Ferry International at the end of July of this year. He was a member of Korn/Ferry's Global Operating Committee and was Executive Vice President at his retirement, and previously had been CEO of Futurestep, an international affiliate of Korn/Ferry. Bobby took over Futurestep when it was losing \$15 million of cash per year and within two years Futurestep was cash flow positive at \$25 million. This was a positive \$40 million cash swing and then he grew the business going forward. In his role at Korn/Ferry he was a featured speaker all over the world and a regular participant at the World Economic Forum held annually in Davos, Switzerland. Bobby had just finished a speech in Mumbai, India one evening several years ago and had just left the Oberoi Hotel in Mumbai when the terrorists attacked that hotel and the adjacent Taj Mahal Palace Hotel on the waterfront in Mumbai. Bobby built a life of service and giving back. He served on many public and private boards including the board of Corporate Services Group PLC, a FTSE 250 London Stock Exchange listed company (they offered him their CEO position if he and Debi and family would move to London) and Hotjobs.com, a New Stock Exchange listed company. Bobby was also serving on the Advisory Board of the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences at West Virginia University, the Board of Visitors of the business school at Vanderbilt University and the Board of Overseers of the Jones School of Business at Rice University. And last year, he was inducted into the Academy of Distinguished Alumni at his beloved West Virginia University. Earlier in his career Bobby was a regional President for Talent Tree, Inc. where he ran the southeast and was based in Atlanta, and later was a Senior Vice President of Kelly Services in Troy, Michigan where he, Debi and Robbe lived in Birmingham, Michigan and enjoyed the 300 member Birmingham Country Club. Bob and Deb and family also lived in Fort Lauderdale where Bobby worked for Wayne Huizinga (of Blockbuster and Florida Marlins fame) as a Group President and COO of one of Republic Industries' companies. Bobby was especially good to his colleagues and was incredibly well respected and loved.

Bobby's theory on people and leadership was that folks want two things: To be Loved, and to Win. He and Debi raised a family, traveled the world, and built a marriage and love affair for the ages. But he was happiest when he was home with his family and their special puppy, Humphrey. He and I ran marathons together, cycled together and traveled all over the place together. But mainly we just talked. I am going to miss that. Bobby and Debi allowed Darlene and me into their life and for that Darlene and I will be eternally grateful. My Mom and brother Mark live in Houston and were very close to Bob and Debi, as well. Darlene just flew in from our home in Asheville, North Carolina and Debi asked Darlene to stay with Debi and her Mother Linda at Debi and Bob's home in Houston. So this is maybe more than you wanted to know, but I want to celebrate Bobby's life. A life of giving back, of excellence and the pursuit of happiness.

He had a stem cell transplant about two and half years ago. He recovered from that but got sick again last football season. He and I and Kristen's husband were at the WVU-TX football game in Austin and Bobby said that he wanted to leave at halftime and I don't believe that he ever felt totally himself after that. My Bro left this earth yesterday afternoon and left a legacy of making a difference and leading a life of loving and winning. Just like his theory on the two things that all people want: To be Loved and to Win. He loved and was loved in return by many, many people and he won. Thanks for thinking about Bobby and our family. This is a hard time. Bobby and I were each other's best friend.
