EXECUTIVE COUNCIL APPROVES CHARTERING PETITION

On June 23rd the Phi Kappa Psi Executive Council voted to approve the chartering petition for our existing colony at West Virginia Alpha. If you recall, our colony was re-established in Fall, 2016. Since this time, 55 new colony members have joined the ranks. The chartering ceremony will take place over the weekend of **November 10th & 11th**.

It was only on June 29, 2016, less than a year ago, did our National Fraternity announce the plan for the formation of a colony at WVU. Getting the chapter back in less than one year is a testament to many, including: our initial chapter consultants-**Marc Munoz (Cal Poly '12)** and **Phil Mikos** (**IUPUI '12**); the colony leaders—President Jesse Lackey and –Vice-President Charles Hageboeck; the Directors of the James Cochran House Association; local (Morgantown alumni) who played a key role behind the scenes; and of course W.C. Bird, who passed on May 22, 2017. Brother Bird made it a personal mission to cross the State of WV meeting and visiting with alumni and re-establishing our network of brothers in key communities. As W.C often stated, we need to "prime the pump of our recruitment pipeline". His efforts have certainly initially paid off, as 50% of the Colony is from West Virginia!

This is vitally important to future sustainability (of the chapter) in terms of having a corps group of brothers that will reside in close proximity to Morgantown to serve as future alumni leaders. We need not look at any further than the fraternity (Sigma Alpha Mu) that leased our house for the last three years. They had -0- local alumni that served in an advisory role. Trust me when I say...and it showed.

As House Corp President John Miesner '82 noted recently, "I express my appreciation to all those, mentioned and unmentioned here, without whose involvement and investment of time over the last three and one-half years of suspension, this approval of the return as a fully active chapter of Phi Kappa Psi would not have come to pass. "Our Strong Band, Indeed"! Before the chapter's suspension in 2013, our chapter had an uninterrupted history of 123-years.

The Chartering Ceremony will be a "big deal"! Many of the National Officers will attend and participate in the ceremony. National Phi Kappa Psi dignitaries (past and present) will be invited. Representatives from our national Phi Psi district will attend. And most importantly, we want YOU, our brother to attend this festive weekend. Setting the historical significance of this event aside, WV Alpha has provided all of us the opportunity to be part of an ancestry unparalleled. The relationships so many of us share all started at 460 & 780 Spruce Street. Mark your calendar now and plan to be in Morgantown **November 10th & 11th**. Great time to celebrate your fraternity and its newest members who represent our next generation of WV Alpha!

COLONY UPDATE— Achieving at the Highest Level!

The decision of the PKP National Executive Council on June 23rd to approve the chartering petition of West Virginia Alpha was the culmination of phenomenal efforts by many. Several colonists, led by VGP Charley Hageboeck, made a strong and emotional presentation noting the many accomplishments achieved by the colonists since Fall 2016. To put this simply in perspective, this has been one of the fastest chartering processes in the history of Phi Kappa Psi. Kudo's to the many alumni who played a key role as well.

In the last year, 54 young men pledged their allegiance to WV Alpha. Four graduated in May 2017. As we look ahead to this current school year, the class distribution of the remaining 49 is as follows: 17 sophomores; 17 juniors; and 15 seniors [Editor's Note: WVU no longer allows freshman recruitment during the Fall term].

When our expansion consultants **Phil Mikos** and **Marc Munoz** arrived on campus in August 2016, they asked about our priorities in terms of recruiting new colony members. We were very clear that what this chapter needed were young men who cared about going to class and achieving at a "very high level". The new member Colony Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the year was 3.22. This was the highest of any fraternity on campus by almost 0.3 pts. Also the highest of any Greek organization.

Highlights of the past year include <u>Community Service Events</u>: WVU Greek Day of Service, packed planting seeds for Zambia, danced at THON in support of the Miracle Children's Network Hospitals, and campus cleanup with Pennsylvania Alpha. In terms of <u>Philanthropy events</u>: MountaineerTHON, raised over \$3,000, held a basketball tournament that raised over \$2,000, and raffled a WVU Basketball Team autographed ball. It should be noted that a very important part of the annual accreditation with National is amount of money each chapter raises per man. Last year, our colonists achieved an average over \$180 per man that benefited various philanthropies noted above. The colonists are already quite immersed in the Greek culture at WVU and won 1st Place in the Greek Week games. They were paired with AOPI and Sigma Nu.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the colonist will have moved back into "the house". But not before many repairs, renovations, and updates were performed this summer. Several of the colonists assisted with the work, including all of the painting work. The plan is to continue functioning at a high level with respect to Philanthropy and Community Service. They will now have to learn to function and operate a chapter house. Learn to govern themselves. Recruitment of new members should become easier having a house and grounds to showcase. A number of the colony members are involved in various student organizations which should help with recruitment.

The Colony took on the challenge to be one of the fastest chartering chapters in history. This mentality is most definitely reflected in the personalities of the chapter officers. They are high achievers, who set lofty goals. West Virginia University is going through a change in Greek Life, it is rebranding Greek Life resulting in several fraternities leaving Morgantown. It is our goal to learn from these mistakes and work towards making WV Alpha the best of the best on campus.



- Catharine "Kitty" Carlin will serve as House Director for the 2017-2018 school term. Catharine, daughter of **Toby Carlin '86**, attended Montour High School in Pittsburgh, PA. Following high school, she enlisted in the WV Air National Guard. Katharine spent a big part of her summer in Alaska with the Air Force. She continues to attend WVU pursuing a degree in Medical Laboratory Science.
- The James Cochran House Corp (i.e. House Corp) was able to collect full rent from the SAM Fraternity over the last three years. They are holding the damage deposit of \$28,500, as repairs to the house have been significantly more than this amount. Additionally, there were multiple upgrades/renovations necessary due to normal wear-ntear. These included plumbing, painting, kitchen updates (including investment for a freezer, commercial refrigerator, and dep fryer (all used), utility/electrical upgrades. Rob Dinsmore '77, of Allegheny Restoration, provided the design/supervision of a new concrete front porch; new landscaping surrounding the chapel and back of fraternity entrance; and replacement of multiple doors to the library and living room. And finally, two additional major projects include: installation of new flooring throughout the entire house; and paving of ALL parking lots. Parking at the house is now "paid parking", as all spaces will be numbered. So next time you are visiting the house, make sure you park in the visitors space! So, what does all of this cost you might ask? All told, the House Corp will be spending \$150,000. In addition to Brother Dinsmore, special thanks to Tom Wiley '76, who was the architect, supervisor, foreman, and project manager for all of this work. And if that was not enough, he also negotiated the contracts for both food services and cleaning services for the chapter house for the 2017-2018 school term.
 - **Robert "Bob" Reynolds '71** and wife, Laura, were recognized on February 10 when West Virginia University announced the Boston couple were giving \$10MM to the WVU College of Business and Economics. The gift will provide initial funding for a building in their names at a new business school complex on Morgantown's waterfront. Bob, a 1974 graduate of the WVU College of Business

and Economics and a member of the WVU Foundation Board of Directors, is president and CEO of three multinational companies: Putnam Investments, Great-West Financial, and Great-West Lifeco U.S.[Editor's Note-Brother Reynolds has also been very generous in his support of our past fraternity campaigns].

- Zach Mendelson '79 participated in the 2017 Nelson Leadership Institute, in honor of Jerry Nelson '48 UCLA), during the week of March 12-18, in Lakeland, FL. Fifty Phi Psi under-grades, along with alumni brothers from across the country took part in this pilot program. Each undergrad was hand-picked because of their commitment to their chapter, campus, and community. The program, PIVOT, is a five-day immersive journey built on exploring the formative "bonds" of life that make individuals and groups successful. The culmination of the week was a dinner recognizing Brother Nelson and also recognizing the inaugural Pivot Program graduates.
- Bruce McMahon ('57 Southern Cal), passed on March 28, 2017. Brother McMahon is a huge loss to Phi Kappa Psi. McMahon was the CEO of McMahan Securities Co. As a Phi psi alumnus, he joined the Foundation Board of trustees in 1994. Along with brother (Jerry) Nelson, they brought computer and internet access to Phi psi chapter houses across the country the financial commitment to provide in-facility networks, computer hardware/software networks, and computer labs to 47 houses initially. The vision of this movement (back in the mid-1990's) was fueled by the concept of scholarship and excellence within Phi Psi. McMahon was recognized as the most significant financial donor to date for Phi Kappa Psi. His legacy will live on through his creation of the PKP McMahan Finance Engine LLC established with his \$3.5MM gift in 2004. He designed this life insurance investment vehicle as part of the Foundation's long-term financial strategy to produce unrestricted funds. In the last 13-years, the PKP McMahan Finance Engine has generated more than \$33MM of benefits for the undergrad brotherhood.

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

For nearly 30 years I have had the honor to be the editor (and scribe) of our newsletter. During this time, many brothers have passed into chapter eternal. But in May we lost two pillars of WV Alpha. Men who lived the Creed, and more importantly, gave back far more to WV Alpha than what they were given. Within the last 90-days, we lost **Terry Turner** '70 and W.C. Bird '65.

Terry Alan Turner passed on May 4th. The Fairmont, WV native worked at Trailer City for the past 25-years where he served as finance and insurance manager. He was an avid photographer (much of his work was on display at the funeral home), lover of music, the Mountaineers, and his passion—WV Alpha. He was a long-term servant of the fraternity, filling the role of chapter advisor for nearly 30-years. As his pledge brother **Rick Pill '70** noted shortly after Terry's passing: "He was dedicated and hard working for the fraternity from the minute he first pledged. We all have so many wonderful memories of him".

It was not unusual for Terry to be at the house several days during the week. He would do the tasks none of us wanted to do. He kept the chapter current with the national fraternity in terms of our accredidation status. He worked with the chapter finances (Terry was the chapter treasurer while in college). He would handle the contracts for kitchen service, cleaning, maintenance, and vendors. He did it all!

He was blessed with the friendship of many brothers whom all shared a lifetime of laughing, loving, traveling, dining, skiing, golfing, and showing up whenever, and wherever, they needed each other.

Walter Clifton "W.C." Bird passed on May 22nd. The Morgantown, WV native was a 1968 graduate of West Virginia School of Journalism. A member of the WVU varsity Club, W.C. earned a varsity letter in tennis while at WVU, a sport which he enjoyed his entire life. He served a full tour in Vietnam where he earned the Bronze Star.

After his service to his country, W.C. began a career with Scott Paper Company starting in sales and progressing to Senior Vice President of Human Resources before retiring. Along with his wife Madonna, his first venture after leaving the corporate world was the development of Ash Mill Farm, a bed n breakfast in Bucks County, PA, which they operated for 7 years.

Upon his return to Morgantown, W.C. jumped back into the fraternity operations and served as the immediate past president of the James Cochran House Association. But, he was much more than just our president. He served as chapter advisor for a period of time. He raised money. He got intimately involved with the WVU Greek advisors group. He managed our chapter through the period of closing the doors and losing our charter...up to our re-colonization of August 2016.


