
As we reminisced about the years, Brother Moore presented us with an envelope containing two Aviator's Badges, a U.S. Army Uniform Collar Pin, a Phi Kappa Psi Badge (James Ronald Moore, WVA ALPHA 1941), and a Phi Kappa Psi Sweetheart Pin (JRM, WVA. A.) all belonging to his older brother, James Ronald Moore '41, 1LT, US AAF.

As Brother Moore recalled the day that his older brother, Ron Moore, was reported Missing in Action via Western Union Telegram, and later pronounced Killed In Action, over the Pacific Ocean during WWII. It was hard for those present to keep the tears at bay.

It was overwhelmingly clear that Brother Moore still misses his older brother very much. Another reminder of how much that so many sacrificed, and many still do today, to maintain the freedom that most of us take for granted. I'm sure I can speak for all of us in extending our utmost gratitude and condolences to both Brothers Moore and their family for their sacrifice and dedication to our Country, Brotherhood, and the priceless gifts. In addition to the pin, badges, and medals, the Moore Family had donated the Memorial Chapel stain glass in recognition of James Ronald. I am humbled by the acts of men like this.

Chapter and Campus Update...

- James P. Clements is the University's 23 rd president, formerly serving as provost and vice president for Towson University.
- In addition to the major renovations this summer at the James Cochran House, both the Phi Sigma Kappa and Tau Kappa Epsilon have been remodeled and relocated. Both were condemned within the last two years, although they remained active in the Greek world. Both fraternity houses are now open.
- WVU has once again exceeded their expected enrollment numbers for 2010. Launched in 2005, the 2010 Strategic Plan wanted 28,500 students in Morgantown, and 30,000 overall within the regional campuses. Presently, 29,000 students attend WVU in Morgantown and overall, 32,000, are enrolled. The University has seen a 4% increase in graduate and professional students; a 7.3% in international students; a 10% increase in online and extended learning; and 17% increase in freshman honors students. The University typically aims for between 4,700 to 4,900 incoming freshmen each year, with the number split 50% in-state versus out-of-state.
- WVU Career Services Center and the Alumni Association established a new mentoring program for WVU Students. Officials hope to have the new program implemented by fall 2010. The Alumni Association is already recruiting alumni to become mentors, promoting it through online newsletter and with Facebook and blogs.
- Two Morgantown natives, Katie Gatian and Jared Ramsey, were named homecoming queen and king, during homecoming weekend festivities, October 24th.
- Student seating at WVU Basketball
 Games will change this year. 380 seats
 in the court level of the student section
 have been removed so to make room for
 the area now known as the "Maniac
 Madhouse" that will seat 836 students in
 standing room only.
- In January 2010, WV Alpha will be represented at the American Leadership
 Academy (ALA) hosted in Cabo San
 Lucas, MX by Jerry Nelson by the following chapter members: Garrett Dinsmore,
 Tony Secret, Slvatore Montalbano, Izaak

- Mendelson, Ryan Kelly, Dom Costa, Jeff Farah, David Campenella, Nick Miraglilo, and Yale Mendelson.
- During the fall, both the ELC/National President tours took place at the chapter house. The chapter receiving outstanding reviews following both events. In addition, many alumni have visited the chapter house during the last two months.

Assuring Our Future Campaign Update...

They say lightning does not strike twice in the same place. Well, it has not only struck twice but three times in the Assuring Our Future Campaign. As reported earlier Brother Bob Douglas 1950 donated \$100,000 to the campaign. He has again donated an additional \$100,000 to the campaign for renovations to 780 Spruce Street. The third lightning strike comes from Brother Bob Reynolds 1971 as he has pledged \$100,000 to the Campaign. We will honor Brother Reynolds with a biography in a future Mountaineer Phi Psi.

Not only do we thank these brothers who are able to make such a large donation, we thank all the Brothers who have donated to the campaign.

Donations and pledges to date are \$565,200. This comes from 140 Brothers. This is an average donation of \$4037. We are eager to hear from the remaining 1400 plus living alumni. NEEDLESS TO SAY, WE NEED YOUR FINANCIAL SUPPORT.

The James Cochran House Corporation Board of Directors along with the chapter and academic advisors worked tirelessly to give the active chapter and all Alumni a finished product that we can all be proud of. The chapter hosted Friday and Saturday receptions when the Mountaineers took on Marshall and Connecticut. A large number of Phi Psi's traveled to Tampa for the South Florida game to promote the campaign. We are planning a major ceremony for dedications of naming rights for Founders Day. The celebration will be held February 20th, 2010.

If you have not seen the renovations yet, the Board will give a guided tour upon request. What did we do with the campaign donations? Completed to date are the following:

- · New energy efficient metal roof
- · New energy efficient windows
- Exterior painted
- · Porch roof and columns repaired
- New House Mothers quarters
- New Officers suite with meeting room
- · New entry hall
- New security system (lights, locks & cameras)
- New fire safety system (fire doors & New electrical system sprinklers)
- · New plumbing system
- New and expanded bathrooms
- · New laundry
- · New heating/cooling system
- Room upgrades (paint and carpet)
- New internet system
- · Upgraded kitchen
- · Many miscellaneous upgrades

More renovations are planned as we secure the additional contributions

It was critical that we accomplish the above without shutting down for renovations. Thus, we did not lose income and more importantly, we kept the brothers together. The active chapter played a major roll in working with the contractors and the Board to assure a great finished product.


We have spent \$2 million to date on the renovations. This is a big number for us to mortgage. Our construction loan goes through the summer of 2010 at which time we will convert to a mortgage based upon dollars raised. The Board is managing your contributions in a conservative way. The intention is to carry as small a mortgage as possible, not to exceed \$1 million which we can cash flow with a full house. The Board also made decisions considering cost savings in the future such as heating, electrical usage, maintenance and security. We are already seeing reduced bills. Naturally we would like to have no mortgage and that is up to YOU and your contributions. We are taking our campaign on the road and will be visiting several cities with the intent of seeing as many brothers as we can by the end of 2009. Please plan to attend these informational events. Pledge class captains have been a major help in the campaign with personal contact to many brothers. They continue to support our efforts. You can help by calling your pledge class brothers and encouraging them to support the campaign.

A full color brochure is in production showing the results of the renovations and will be sent to you shortly. We will follow the brochure with a three day phone-a-thon Dec 4, 5, and 6 intended to answer questions and ask for your tax deductible contribution before year end.

The fraternity system at WVU has improved dramatically and we clearly lead the way with our house and our active brothers. We pledged 16 for the Fall semester with a majority coming from West Virginia.

Please find a way to visit 780 Spruce and relive some of the memories of your college days. The House Corporation Board welcomes your visit, comments and donations.
